Our topic this term is 'All about Me'

This half-term the Nursery children will be settling in to their new school and classroom. They will be given lots of opportunities to develop their speech, communication and language skills by talking about themselves and their families. As well as developing their personal, social and emotional skills by forming positive relationships with their peers and adults. As a Right's Respecting school we believe that it is very important for our children to develop positive learning behaviours and skills that will develop them as respectful citizens of our community. Therefore, we will be learning about some of our school values: Friendship, Respect, Kindness, Perseverance, Empathy, Responsibility and Justice through stories and circle time activities. Our topic this term is 'All about me'. The children will have the opportunity to talk about themselves and their families with their Nursery friends and teachers. We will be reading stories to support this topic in our key groups. You may like to look at some of these books so that you can talk about these stories and themes with your child.

Spare clothes

Your child needs to have a full change of spare clothes on their peg, including socks and underwear. Please make sure EVERYTHING has their name on it, this bag can stay on their peg. If your child is in pull-ups or nappies, please provide spares as well as wipes, we will continue to support their progress with independent toileting.

Weekly £1 fund

Please could you use our online system or bring in £1.00 on Mondays to donate £1.00 each week so we can buy extra things to make learning exciting, such as ingredients for cooking, beads and sequins for sticking and new toys to explore! You will have the option to donate weekly, or in advance e.g. £13 for a term or £39 for the year.

Home Learning

Please read with your child every day, talk about the pictures together and ask questions such as "what can you see?" or "what do you think will happen next?" You may find your child wants to repeat stories they have already heard; this repetition is good for their early literacy skills. Please let us know if you do not have access to books at home so we can support you with this.

Attendance and Punctuality

It is very important that your child comes to school every day so they are confident to talk to others and able to make friends.


Arriving at school on time is vital, we have had lots of children arriving late which interrupts learning time for all children. The nursery gate is shut at 9am / 12.40pm promptly, after this time you will need to go to the main school office.

Collections

The Nursery gate will be open for collecting your child at 11.35-11.45am / 3:15-3.30pm. After this time the gate will be closed and you will have to go to the main office. The school has a late collection policy where you may be charged if you are continuously late when picking up your child.

What your child needs to have at school every day:

- Full uniform
- Sensible shoes with Velcro
- Coat



Other children do not need to bring snack as we provide water, milk and fruit every day
